## **Chair's Report**

Welcome to our 2020/21 Annual report.

As the peak body for independent disability advocacy agencies in Victoria, we continue to Inform, lead and advocate at a state and national level to break down the barriers for people with a disability.

Disability Advocacy Victoria Inc. is not directly funded by the government. We do receive financial support from the Victorian Council of Social Services (VCOSS), through the Disability Advocacy Resource Unit (DARU) in recognition of the work done with our members and for work on DARU Governance Group. These funds assist with our administration.

Due to these funds, we have been able to employ a consultant to begin working on our major project for the year, a submission to the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with a Disability (DRC). Paul Ramcharan commenced with DAV Inc. in early 2021. He has a deep understanding of the issues facing the disability advocacy sector in Victoria which enabled him to 'hit the ground running'. Right from the onset he commenced consulting with our members and facilitated several forums with members of the sector. Paul was also able to gain data via surveys and one on one meetings with advocates.

I would like to thank all those members and non-members who took the time to provide Paul with data and narrative to support DAV Inc.'s submission which is in its final stages prior to submitting to the Royal Commission.

### **Chair's Report**

It was pleasing to see the Royal Commission extend its life due to the impacts of COVID-19 and the introduction of confidentiality protections for those who make submissions. DAV advocated for these changes along with many other peak bodies, disability organisations, advocacy groups and supporters across Australia.

With the departure of Commissioner Atkinson, DAV Inc. wrote to Commissioner Ronald Sackville and requested the Commission recruit a person who has lived experience of disabilities to be considered for such an appointment.

Throughout the year Disability Advocacy Victoria Inc. continued to meet virtually due to the COVID-19 restrictions and we were able to continue our representation and interest in the following networks and committees:

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial report of DISABILITY ADVOCACY VICTORIA INC (the association), which comprises the Statement by Members of the Committee, the Income and Expenditure Statement, Balance Sheet as at 30 June 2021, a summary of significant accounting policies and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the association as at 30 June 2021 and [of] its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. 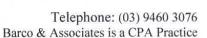
